## **Interest-Free Physician Loan Program**

Physicians establishing a medical practice within the Nord-Aski REDC catchment area may qualify for an interest-free loan of up to \$150,000 to help cover their setup costs.

This program, the result of a progressive partnership between the Nord-Aski Regional Economic Development Corporation and the newly created Hearst Medical Recruitment Alliance, will provide immediate financial assistance to any new doctor who chooses to practice medicine in our region. While the medical recruitment field is facing numerous challenges, the partners hope that this additional incentive can attract new doctors in the region and help reduce the staggering rate of unattached patients presently found within the Hearst regional medical structure. As we stand, 61% of our population does not have access to regular primary care services, a severe crisis that is putting an unsustainable strain on our local health system.
